### **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill would grant employees of certain employers the right to take leave from work to participate in day care, preschool or school (K through 12) activities involving the employee's child. The employee could substitute their existing leave, paid or unpaid, for the unpaid leave provided by the bill.

Employees of the State of Wisconsin who felt their rights under the bill had been violated could seek enforcement of those rights by filing a complaint with the Personnel Commission. Employees of other employers in Wisconsin would tile their enforcement proceedings with the Department of Workforce Development.

This estimate only addresses the fiscal consequences on the Personnel Commission of the enforcement procedure before the Commission. It does not attempt to discern any possible consequences on the productivity of persons employed by the State of Wisconsin who would be eligible for leave under the bill. This estimate also does not reflect the costs to state agencies associated with defending the claims permitted by the bill.

The Commission assumes that the number of complaints filed would be no larger than the number of claims now filed under the Family Medical Leave Act (FMLA). In 1998, 1999 and 2000, 38 of the 617 complaints filed with and processed by the Commission included claims alleging a violation of the FMLA. Of those 38 cases, all but 13 included claims of other forms of discrimination/retaliation, such as age or sex. For purposes of this fiscal estimate, the Commission assumes that all 25 of those cases would have been filed even if there had been no allegation of a violation of the FMLA.

The Commission assumes there would be no more than 4 additional cases filed with the Commission annually due to the proposal in the bill to establish a right to school activities leave. Existing staff would be able to absorb this nominal estimated increase in caseload without additional expenditures.

#### One time costs

Passage of this bill would require no more than 20 hours of staff time for making changes to the Personnel Commission's website and to existing printed materials relating to the Commission's authority.
