

2001 ASSEMBLY BILL 268

March 30, 2001 – Introduced by Representatives BLACK, BALOW, BERCEAU, BOCK, BOYLE, CARPENTER, COGGS, LA FAVE, LASSA, J. LEHMAN, MILLER, PLOUFF, POCAN, RYBA, SINICKI, STASKUNAS, TURNER, WASSERMAN and YOUNG, cosponsored by Senators JAUCH, BAUMGART, BURKE, DECKER, ERPENBACH, GROBSCHMIDT, PLACHE and RISSER. Referred to Committee on Tax and Spending Limitations.

1 **AN ACT** *to create* 121.91 (4) (i) of the statutes; **relating to:** increasing a school
2 district's revenue limit by the amount spent for school security measures and
3 granting rule-making authority.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law generally limits the increase in the total amount of revenue per pupil that a school district may receive from general school aids and property taxes in a school year to the amount of revenue increase allowed per pupil in the previous school year increased by the percentage change in the consumer price index. Several exceptions are provided. For example, if a school district increases the services that it provides by adding responsibility for providing a service transferred to it from another governmental unit, its revenue limit is increased by the cost of that service.

This bill provides that a school district's revenue limit in any school year is increased by an amount equal to the amount spent by the school district in that school year for security measures designed to prevent criminal activity in schools, but not more than an amount equal to \$100 multiplied by the number of pupils enrolled.
