347.26 (11) (am) In addition to lamps authorized under this subsection, a motor truck having a gross vehicle weight of more than 8,000 pounds shall be equipped with a 360-degree rotating or flashing amber light mounted at the highest practicable point. The rotating or flashing amber lamp shall be lighted only when the motor truck is upon a highway having a maximum speed limit of more than 35 miles per hour and the motor truck is traveling 10 or more miles below the maximum speed limit, when the truck is stopped on such highways, or when the truck is backing-up on such highways.

Current law generally prohibits any vehicle from displaying any flashing light. Specific exceptions allow flashing lights to be displayed on police vehicles, fire engines, ambulances, school buses, mail delivery vehicles, highway maintenance vehicles, and other vehicles. This bill ~~authorizes~~ motor trucks to be equipped with ~~an~~ amber ~~stroke~~ light that may be operated only when the motor truck is upon a highway having a maximum speed limit of more than 35 miles per hour and traveling ten or more miles per hour below the speed limit, stopped, or backing up.
