## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill creates additional criminal offenses relating to prostitution and pandering. In addition, this bill proposes to prohibit, as a condition of parole or extended supervision, the offender from being in the vicinity of where the prostitution or pandering occurred. Finally, this bill provides for a deferred prosecution program for certain offenders if 1) there is a public or private treatment program offered in the offender's community, and 2) the offender can pay for the treatment.

In calendar year 1998 40 persons were admitted to prison and 122 to probation for conviction of one of the crimes listed in the bill. Deferred prosecution could decrease these numbers and expansion of the definition of prostitution could increase the numbers. Thus, it is not possible to estimate the bill's fiscal impact.

The Department is unable to determine the impact of this bill on local communities and jail bed usage.
