## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

The extension of collective bargaining and interest arbitration to certain law enforcement supervisors will cause the formation of additional bargaining units of law enforcement supervisors and both the new units and existing supervisory units will exercise the newly granted collective bargaining/interest arbitration rights. Formation of these additional bargaining units will generate additional election cases and exercise of the collective bargaining/interest arbitration rights will generate additional mediation, complaint, interest arbitration and grievance arbitration cases for the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission. The Commission may be able to absorb this fiscal impact using existing resources.

Exercise of the collective bargaining/interest arbitration rights by unions representing law enforcement supervisors will increase the wage and fringe benefit costs for affected local governmental entities (cities, villages and towns having a population of 2500 or more and counties). The Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission has no basis for accurately estimating the extent of the increase.
