

2001 ASSEMBLY BILL 328

April 18, 2001 – Introduced by Representative ALBERS, cosponsored by Senator BURKE, by request of Claims Board. Referred to Joint committee on Finance.

1 **AN ACT relating to:** expenditure of \$13,785.25 from moneys appropriated to the
2 department of transportation in payment of a claim against the state made by
3 the city of West Allis.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill directs expenditure of \$13,785.25 from moneys appropriated to the department of transportation (DOT) for the current fiscal biennium for improvement of existing state trunk highways and connecting highways and bridges, for construction and rehabilitation of interstate highways, and for certain related programs in payment of a claim against DOT by the city of West Allis. In 1993–94, the city incurred real estate acquisition costs in connection with an improvement project for South 76th Street, 80% of which would have been eligible for federal and state financial participation if an application for approval of federal financial participation had been timely filed. The city relied upon DOT to file the application, but due to an oversight by a DOT employee the application was not filed in a timely manner. On October 19, 1999, the claims board recommended payment of this claim (see 1999 *Senate Journal*, pp. 307–308).
