Under current law, the department of justice (DOJ) is required to maintain a toll-free telephone number for persons to provide information regarding suspected violations of laws concerning controlled substances (dangerous drugs). This bill requires DOJ to maintain a single toll-free telephone number both for information regarding suspected controlled substances law violations and for persons to anonymously provide information regarding dangerous weapons in public schools. The bill also provides that ~~on~~ receiving any information regarding dangerous weapons in a public school, DOJ is required to provide the information to the administration of the public school and the appropriate law enforcement agency for the municipality in which the public school is located.

The bill also provides that immediately upon receiving any information regarding dangerous weapons in a public school, or immediately the next business day if the call is received outside business hours, DOJ is required to forward the information to the administration of the public school and the appropriate law enforcement agency for the municipality in which the public school is located.

5 the next retail business day if the information is not received during normal retail
6 business hours, the department of justice shall provide the information to all of the

8 (a) The administration of the public school.

9 (b) The appropriate law enforcement agency, as defined in s. 165.83 (1) (b), for
10 the municipality in which the public school is located.
