

## 2001 ASSEMBLY BILL 396

May 14, 2001 – Introduced by Representatives JOHNSRUD, BERCEAU, SCHOOFF and STASKUNAS, cosponsored by Senators M. MEYER, RISSER, ROBSON and ROSENZWEIG. Referred to Committee on Colleges and Universities.

1     **AN ACT to amend** 39.30 (2) (intro.) of the statutes; **relating to:** eligibility for  
2           Wisconsin tuition grants.

### *Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau*

Under current law, a resident student who is enrolled at least half-time at an accredited, nonprofit Wisconsin college or university is eligible for a tuition grant. This bill makes a resident student who is enrolled at least half-time in a Wisconsin branch or campus of an accredited, nonprofit college or university located in another state eligible for a tuition grant.

***The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:***

3           **SECTION 1.** 39.30 (2) (intro.) of the statutes is amended to read:  
4           39.30 (2) **ELIGIBILITY.** (intro.) A resident student who is enrolled at least  
5           half-time and registered as a freshman, sophomore, junior, or senior in an  
6           accredited, nonprofit, post-high school, educational institution in this state or who  
7           is so enrolled and registered in an in-state branch or campus of an accredited,

**SECTION 1**

1 nonprofit, post-high school educational institution located in another state shall be  
2 eligible for grants under this section for each semester of attendance, but:

3 **SECTION 2. Initial applicability.**

4 (1) This act first applies to students enrolled and registered on the effective  
5 date of this subsection.
