## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

Under current law, each school board must annually, by January 1, distribute to the parent or guardian of each pupil enrolled in the school district a copy of the school and school district performance report. This bill requires that a school board, annually, by May 1, send each parent or guardian a notice that the school performance report (SPR) is available upon the parent or guardian's request, produce a copy upon request, and, if the school district maintains an Internet site, make the report available to the public at that site.

Costs to districts would be associated with preparing and sending notices to parents and guardians that the SPR is available, and making the report available on the district's Internet site, if a district maintains an Internet site. School district costs for preparing and sending notices to parents and guardians would vary from district to district, depending on the number of notices, and are indeterminate. Because the school district would no longer be required to send a copy of the SPR to each parent or guardian, under the bill, school districts may realize a cost savings, but these savings are also indeterminate. A school district would be able to provide the SPR on its Internet site at little, if any, additional expense.
