## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, the pension benefits of certain public employees are exempt from state taxes, including individuals who were members of or retired from the following plans as of December 31, 1963: U.S. Civil service or military, Milwaukee city and county, Milwaukee police officers and public school teachers, Wisconsin state teachers' retirement fund, and Milwaukee County sheriff's annuity and benefit fund.

This bill expands the current exemption to include previously non-exempt pension income for all retirees, public and private, provided that the filer's pension income is not already exempt from taxation. The proposed exemption would include all distributions from pension, profit-sharing, and stock bonus plans, deferred compensation plans, self-employed plans, non-qualified retirement plans, and individual retirement accounts (IRAs).

Based on a simulation using the 1999 Wisconsin Individual Income Tax Model, this bill would reduce revenues by \$356 million annually. This estimate assumed that all social security retirement benefits would also be exempt under this bill; if this is not the case, the proposal would reduce revenues by \$286.5 million annually.
