AN ACT *to amend* 755.02 of the statutes; **relating to:** terms of municipal judges.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a municipal court judge is elected at large for a term of two years unless the municipality has established a longer term of not to exceed four years. This bill requires all municipal court judges to be elected for four—year terms.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 755.02 of the statutes is amended to read:
- 3 **755.02 Term.** The judges shall be elected at large for a term of $2 \frac{4}{9}$ years unless
- 4 a longer term, not exceeding 4 years, is provided by ordinance or bylaw. The term
- 5 shall commence on May 1 of the year of the judge's election.
