JOINT LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL PREFATORY NOTE: This draft was prepared for the joint legislative council's special committee on developmental disabilities. The draft requires the department of health and family services to create a task force charged to develop a plan for the state centers for the developmentally disabled. The task force must include representatives from the following stakeholder groups and agencies:

1. The department of health and family services.
2. The department of veterans affairs.
3. The department of corrections.
4. The governor's office.
5. The American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees union and other labor groups.
6. Parents or guardians of current state center residents.
7. Former and current state center residents.
8. Advocates for persons with developmental disabilities.
9. The board member of an intermediate care facility for the mentally retarded.
10. Organizations that provide services to person with developmental disabilities in the community.
11. County departments that provide services to persons with developmental disabilities.

The task force is charged with developing a plan to do all of the following:

1. Specify the future role of the state centers for the developmentally disabled, and the state, in providing services for persons with developmental disabilities.

2. Maximize the potential for independent living in the most appropriate setting for each person residing in the state centers, according to the person's wishes.

Hi Debora.

After reviewing the drafter's note to the above-referenced draft, I would prefer it if you could retain the previous language in SECTION 1(1)(a)1 and 3. I think they mean two different things.

SECTION 1(1)(a) 1 requires the plan to specify how the state centers will provide DD services in the future. For example, centers may provide specialized medical care to DD persons living in the community, or may provide respite care.

SECTION 1(1)(a)3 requires the plan to specify what role, **other than to provide** DD services, the centers will play in the future. For example, centers may convert to correctional or veterans facilities.

If you still think they are redundant, let me know and we can work out some alternative language.
