August 21, 2001 – Introduced by Representatives Musser, Coggs, Schneider, Ainsworth, La Fave, Boyle, Berceau, Pocan, Riley and Morris-Tatum, cosponsored by Senators George and Moore. Referred to Committee on Assembly Organization.

- 1 AN ACT *to create* 13.015 of the statutes; **relating to:** delegates from tribal governments to the legislature.
 - Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires each house of the legislature to permit at least one tribal delegate to be seated in the house. The bill allows each house to determine the number of delegates that have a seat and the privileges that a delegate has under the rules of the house or under the joint rules or both. It requires that delegates be selected by a process that is unanimously agreed upon by the elected governing bodies of the tribes. The delegates would represent tribal governments.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 13.015 of the statutes is created to read:
