Bill drafting request for Rep. Johnsrud

**The problem:** Currently, DNR properties are given names by the Governor appointed Natural Resources Board. These names are important because properties will be referred to by those names in administrative code and statutes and for public relations. Including all agencies, I am not able to find legislation that establishes a process for naming properties or buildings.

**Example:** The DNR Board recently named a fish hatchery and a state park after Governor Tommy Thompson. There was little public input or warning to legislators that a name was going to be selected.

**The solution:** Create legislation which specifies that only the legislature can give official names to properties. This would apply to all state-owned properties and buildings, not just DNR managed ones.

This legislation would apply to all state-owned properties and buildings acquired after enactment of this legislation.

Analysis

Currently, some state-owned buildings, structures, facilities, or properties are given names by law. Although the statutes do not specifically treat the issue, other state-owned buildings, structures, facilities, or properties have been formally or informally named by the agencies having jurisdiction over them.

This bill provides that the official names of state-owned buildings, structures, facilities, or properties (including federal and state highways and portions thereof) are the names given to them by law. The bill also prohibits any state agency from designating a name for any state-owned building, structure, facility, or property. However, the bill provides that any name given to a state-owned building, structure, facility, or property by a state agency having exclusive jurisdiction over that building, structure, facility, or property before the bill becomes law is valid unless otherwise provided by law.

SECTION 1. 16.848 of the statutes is created to read:

16.848 Names of state buildings, structures, facilities, and properties.

(1) In this section:

(a) "Agency" has the meaning given in s. 16.70 (1).

(b) "Facility" includes a highway, as defined in s. 340.01 (22), that is under the jurisdiction of the department of transportation or any portion ~~thereof~~ of ~~such a~~ highway

(c) "Name" does not include a numeric or alphanumeric designation.

(d) "Property" means a unit of state-owned land that is geographically separated or administered separately from other state-owned land.

(2) Except as provided in sub. (4), the official names of state buildings, structures, facilities, or properties are the names given to them by law.

(3) No agency may designate a name for any state-owned building, structure, facility, or property.

(4) Any name given to a state-owned building, structure, facility, or property by an agency having exclusive jurisdiction over that building, structure, facility, or property prior to the effective date of this subsection [revisor inserts date] is valid unless otherwise provided by law.

SECTION 2. 27.01 (2) (h) of the statutes is repealed.

SECTION 3. 27.01 (5) of the statutes is amended to read:

27.01 (5) ROADSIDE PARKS. All areas designated as roadside parks shall be a part of the state park system. Roadside parks will consist of naturally attractive parcels of land, 5 acres or more in size, immediately contiguous to a state trunk highway.

Each such area ~~shall carry a distinctive name and shall~~ be managed and developed as a part of the state park system.

In order not to burden the legislature with naming bills and to allow some buildings, structures, facilities, or properties to be named after a period of years from the time they are built or acquired, you may wish to allow a state agency having exclusive jurisdiction over a state-owned building, structure, facility, or property to provisionally name the building, structure, facility, or property with the name of the function it serves or with the name of a nearby geographic place or feature, until the legislature gets around to formally naming it. *that*
