

2001 ASSEMBLY BILL 496

September 19, 2001 – Introduced by Representatives MUSSER, PETTIS, TURNER, KRAWCZYK, RYBA, JESKEWITZ, SHERMAN, LADWIG, SUDER, BOYLE, TOWNSEND, FREESE, GRONEMUS, J. FITZGERALD, STARZYK, OLSEN, GUNDRUM, GUNDERSON, STONE, MCCORMICK, SYKORA, PETROWSKI, PLOUFF, VRAKAS, OWENS and LEIBHAM, cosponsored by Senators BURKE, RISSER, GEORGE, HANSEN and BAUMGART. Referred to Committee on Veterans and Military Affairs.

 3 **relating to:** tuition vouchers for students who sound Taps at military honors
 4 funerals.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under this bill, a student at a high school, University of Wisconsin (UW) System school, in-state technical college, or in-state, private, accredited, nonprofit college or university is eligible for a \$25 tuition voucher if he or she sounds “Taps” on a bugle, trumpet, or coronet at a military honors funeral. The bill requires the board of regents of the UW System or the technical college board to grant a student a \$25 remission of tuition or academic fees for each valid voucher that is issued to the student. A voucher is valid for six years.
