Hi Peter:

Thanks for the help yesterday on the "academic fees" language in AB 496. Today, Rep. Musser has asked me to have you draft a sub amendment to the bill to do the following:

- ✓1. include middle school students (as well as the high school students already included)
- ✓2. eliminate the 6-year limitation for using the vouchers and instead provide that the vouchers may be used at any time for undergraduate education.
- ✓3. clarify that the vouchers are not transferable to another person
- ✓4. encourage schools to grant excused absences to students who wish to perform Taps at military honors funerals
5. direct the Department of Veterans Affairs to develop and distribute voucher forms to funeral directors

If Bob Nelson needs to work on portions of this sub, could you please coordinate that with him? Rep. Musser plans to schedule the bill for a vote on October 10, so we need it next week.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under this bill, a student at a high school, University of Wisconsin (UW) System school, in-state technical college, or in-state, private, accredited, nonprofit college or university is eligible for a \$25 tuition voucher if he or she sounds "Taps" on a bugle, trumpet, or coronet at a military honors funeral. The bill requires the board of regents of the UW System or the technical college board to grant a student a \$25 remission of tuition or academic fees for each valid voucher that is issued to the student. A voucher is valid for six years.

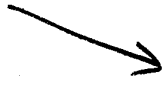

23 Wisconsin System institution as provided under s. 36.27 (3r) *or* a technical college *college* as
24 provided under s. 38.24 (6) *for a private, accredited, nonprofit college or university*.
