4	of the statutes; relating to: retired peace officers carrying a weapon and the
5	content of operators' licenses and identification cards issued by the department
6	of transportation and requiring the exercise of rule-making authority.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 343.14 (2) (j) of the statutes is created to read:
- 343.14 **(2)** (j) A question as to whether, if the applicant is a retired peace officer, he or she wishes to have the department include on the license document the designation described under s. 343.17 (3) (a) 14.
- **SECTION 2.** 343.17 (3) (a) 14. of the statutes is created to read:

343.17 **(3)** (a) 14. If the person has requested the inclusion of the designation under s. 343.14 (2) (j) and the department has verified that the person is a retired peace officer under rules promulgated under sub. (6), a designation that the person is a retired peace officer.

SECTION 3. 343.17 (6) of the statutes is amended to read:

343.17 **(6)** RULES. Subject to subs. (2) and (3), the department shall promulgate rules setting the design and specifications for the license document and subsequent changes thereto. The rules shall also include procedures for verifying whether an applicant is a retired peace officer, as defined in s. 941.23 (1) (b), for the purposes of the designation under s. 343.17 (3) (a) 14.

SECTION 4. 343.19 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

343.19 (1) If a license issued under this chapter or an identification card issued under s. 343.50 is lost or destroyed eff. the name or address named in the license or identification card is changed eff. the condition specified in s. 343.17 (3) (a) 12. or 13. no longer applies, or the condition specified in s. 343.17 (3) (a) 14. applies, the person to whom the license or identification card was issued may obtain a duplicate thereof or substitute therefor upon furnishing proof satisfactory to the department of name and date of birth and that the license or identification card has been lost or destroyed or that application for a duplicate license or identification card is being made for a change of address or name eff. because the condition specified in s. 343.17 (3) (a) 12. or 13. no longer applies, or because the condition specified in s. 343.17 (3) (a) 14. applies. If the original license or identification card is found it shall immediately be transmitted to the department. Duplicates of nonphoto licenses shall be issued as nonphoto licenses.

SECTION 5. 343.50 (4) of the statutes is amended to read:

343.50 (4) APPLICATION. The application for an identification card shall include		
any information required under ss. 85.103 (2) and 343.14 (2) (a), (b), (bm), and (br),		
such further information as the department may reasonably require to enable it to		
determine whether the applicant is entitled by law to an identification card and, for		
applicants who are aged 65 years or older, material, as provided by the department,		
explaining the voluntary program that is specified in s. 71.55 (10) (b). The		
department shall include on the application form the question described in s. 343.14		
(2) (j) and shall, as part of the application process, take a photograph of the applicant		
to comply with sub. (3). No application may be processed without the photograph		
being taken. Misrepresentations in violation of s. 343.14 (5) are punishable as		
provided in s. 343.14 (9). The rules promulgated under s. 343.17 (6) for verifying		
whether an applicant is a retired peace officer apply to applications for identification		
cards.

941.23 **(2)** Any person except a peace officer <u>or a qualified retired peace officer</u> who goes armed with a concealed and dangerous weapon is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.

SECTION 7. 941.23 (1) of the statutes is created to read:

941.23 **(1)** In this section:

- (a) "Qualified retired peace officer" means a retired peace officer who meets all of the following requirements:
- 1. Within the preceding 2-year period, the retired peace officer has successfully completed a course of 8 hours or less that is offered by a technical college and that covers the safe use and storage of a handgun or an equivalent course. This

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1 subdivision does not apply during the 2-year period immediately following a retired 2 peace officer's retirement from active service as a peace officer. 3 2. The retired peace officer holds a valid state identification card that contains 4 the designation described in s. 343.17 (3) (a) 14. 5 (b) "Retired peace officer" means a person who has retired from active service 6 as a peace officer and who, immediately upon retirement from active service, 7 qualified for an annuity under the Wisconsin retirement system, the retirement 8 system of any 1st class city, or any retirement system established under chapter 201, 9 laws of 1937. 10 (c) "State identification card" means an operator's license issued under ch. 343 11 that contains a photograph of the license holder or an identification card issued 12 under s. 343.50. 13 **SECTION 8.** 941.23 (3) of the statutes is created to read: 14 941.23 (3) If he or she is carrying a concealed weapon, a qualified retired peace 15 officer shall carry his or her state identification card and shall, upon the request of 16 any law enforcement officer, display it to the law enforcement officer. 17 **Section 9.** 941.235 (2) of the statutes is renumbered 941.235 (2) (intro.) and amended to read: 18 19 941.235 (2) (intro.) This section does not apply to any of the following: 20 (a) A peace officers or armed officer. (c) Armed forces or military personnel who go armed in the line of duty or to any. 21 22 (d) Any person duly authorized by the chief of police of any city, village or town, 23 the chief of the capitol police or the sheriff of any county to possess a firearm in any 24 building under sub. (1).
