

**ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 10,
TO 2001 ASSEMBLY BILL 576**

October 23, 2001 – Offered by Representative BOYLE.

1 At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

2 **1.** Page 1, line 5: after “program” insert “, the maximum duration of
3 unemployment insurance benefits payable to certain employees.”.

4 **2.** Page 5, line 2: after that line insert:

5 “**SECTION 5k.** 108.02 (25c) of the statutes is created to read:

6 108.02 **(25c)** TOURISM INDUSTRY. “Tourism industry” means businesses that
7 serve members of the traveling public, including restaurant, lodging, and
8 transportation businesses.

9 **SECTION 5L.** 108.06 (1) of the statutes is renumbered 108.06 (1) (intro.) and
10 amended to read:

11 108.06 **(1)** (intro.) Except as provided in sub. (6) and ss. 108.141 and 108.142,
12 no claimant may receive total benefits based on employment in a base period greater
13 than ~~26~~ the maximum number of weeks specified in this subsection times the

1 claimant's weekly benefit rate under s. 108.05 (1) or 40% of the claimant's base period
2 wages, whichever is lower. Except as provided in sub. (6) and ss. 108.141 and
3 108.142, if a claimant's base period wages are reduced or canceled under s. 108.04
4 (5), (7), (8) (a) or (18), or suspended under s. 108.04 (1) (f), (10) (a) or (17), the claimant
5 may not receive total benefits based on employment in a base period greater than 26
6 the maximum number of weeks specified in this subsection times the claimant's
7 weekly benefit rate under s. 108.05 (1) or 40% of the base period wages not reduced,
8 canceled or suspended which were paid or payable to the claimant, whichever is
9 lower. The maximum number of weeks is:

10 **SECTION 5m.** 108.06 (1) (a) and (b) of the statutes are created to read:

11 108.06 (1) (a) Except as provided in sub. (7), for benefit years of claimants who
12 were employed by an employer in the tourism industry on September 11, 2001, and
13 in which the claimant's initial week of unemployment begins during the period
14 beginning on September 8, 2001 and ending on December 29, 2002, 39 weeks.

15 (b) For other benefit years, 26 weeks.

16 **SECTION 5n.** 108.06 (7) of the statutes is created to read:

17 108.06 (7) If a claimant is not totally or partially unemployed prior to
18 September 12, 2001 or after December 31, 2002, the maximum number of weeks of
19 benefits payable to that claimant is 26 weeks, except as provided in sub. (6) and ss.
20 108.141 and 108.142.”.
