Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill increases a school district's revenue limit in any school year by the amount spent by the district in the previous school year for participation of pupils in statewide tournaments and competitions. Beginning in the 2002-03 school year, the state would be required to increase general school aids by two-thirds of the amount spent by school districts in the prior year for participation in certain activities. Because the department does not require school districts to separately report their expenditures related to statewide competitions, the amount that statewide revenue limits or partial school revenues would increase is unknown.

State fiscal effect

The state would be required to increase general school aids by two-thirds the amount spent by districts in the prior year for statewide competitions in order to maintain its two-thirds funding commitment.

Local fiscal effect

Local school property taxes would increase by a maximum of one-third the amount spent by districts in the prior year for statewide competitions.
