Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill would require two positions in the Department of Electronic Government (DEG) be assigned to special duties. One position would serve as the State Privacy Officer and the other, as the State Security Officer.

While existing DEG staff deal with both privacy and security, the dedication of two staff to these positions may require reallocation of resource from other areas. Similarly, the bill's requirements for completion of Privacy Impact Statement reviews will also require a reallocation of resource.

It should be noted that the bill requires these positions to report to a classified division administrator [under ch 230.08(4)(b)5]. This provision may be problematic, as DEG has only three division administrators and all are unclassified under the statutes.
