## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill concerns invasions of privacy. There are several sections of the legislation that are pertinent to the University System.

Under current law, the University of Wisconsin System is already prohibited from assigning to any student an identification number that is identical to or incorporates the student's social security number. Thus this proposal will not have a fiscal effect on our institutions.

In addition, this legislation would require that each institution and two year collegiate campus of the University of Wisconsin System athletic team that has its home field or arena in this state to adopt a written policy on who may enter and remain in the locker room used by the school or team to interview or seek information from any person. This will not have a fiscal effect on our institutions.

Finally, the proposed changes in the public record statute would affect the manner in which the University System responds to requests for public information. This will not have a fiscal effect on our institutions.
