## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

The Department of Employee Trust Funds estimates that 62 persons will be eligible for military service credit under this bill. The additional amount of annuity paid under this bill would be from general purpose revenue (GPR). It is assumed that the 62 persons receiving military service credit under this bill will receive an average of 2 years of credit.

The Department of Employee Trust Funds reports that, in 2000, 7,338 persons retired from the Wisconsin Retirement System (WRS) with an average of approximately 30 years of service. Adding 124 years of service under the bill would increase the total number of years of service claimed by .06%. The average WRS annuity for 2000 was \$21,551. Multiplying this figure by .06% and multiplying the product of this calculation by 7,338 yields an estimate that this bill would increase GPR expenditures by \$89,077 annually.
