## 2001 ASSE MBLY BILL 661

December 3, 2001 - Introduced by Representatives Pettis, Suder, Krawczyk, Musser, Sykora, Bies, Freese and Ott, cosponsored by Senators Harsdorf, Darling and Roessler. Referred to Committee on Criminal J ustice.

An ACT to create 961.573 (4) of the statutes; relating to: possession with intent to use or use of drug paraphernalia and providing a penalty.

## Anal ysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law prohibits possession with intent to use or use of drug paraphernalia for a variety of activities including growing, making, processing, analyzing, or storing a controlled substance. The penalty for violating this prohibition is confinement in jail for not more than 30 days or a fine not to exceed $\$ 500$ or both. If the paraphernalia is for prohibited activities related to methamphetamine or a controlled substance analog of methamphetamine, the penalty is a term of imprisonment (consisting of confinement in prison followed by extended supervision) not to exceed five years or a fine not to exceed $\$ 10,000$ or both.

This bill increases the penalty for possession with intent to use or use of drug paraphernalia for prohibited activities related to methamphetamine or a controlled substance anal og of methamphetamine, to a term of imprisonment not to exceed 10 years or a fine not to exceed $\$ 20,000$ or both, if the possession or use occurs on a premises where a person who is under the age of 18 resides.

## ASSE MBLY BILL 661

Section 1. 961.573 (4) of the statutes is created to read:
961.573 (4) Any person who violates sub. (3) while on a premises where a person who is under age 18 resides may be fined not more than $\$ 20,000$ or imprisoned for not more than 10 years or both.
