Dear Rob:

What we would want is to give all towns "village powers" which

would be the same authority that the town electors at a town meeting would give the town boards under Sec. 60.10(2)©. We are not asking to incorporate all towns as villages. This bill should in effect give all towns "statutory village powers" without the need to have the town electors grant the authority to town boards by a town meeting vote. This is important because we have some towns where the electors at a town meeting have voted against giving the town board village powers, because they believe the town board will have too great of authority. WTA believes in view of the "smart growth" law all town board should have the authority to have "village powers" by a statutory grant of authority rather than have the requirement to have the electors grant the authority at a town meeting.

I would ask you to forward this email on to Marc Shovers. I will call him on Monday and verify what WTA is looking for if that is OK?

Hi Bob:

You are correct that I am the attorney who would draft a bill in this area. Actually, however, it's not that straightforward and I'm not sure exactly what Rep. Freese wants.

Under s. 60.10 (2) © of the statutes, an annual town meeting may authorize the town board to exercise village powers under s. 60.22 (3). If the town board is authorized to exercise village powers and it does so, the board may "exercise powers relating to villages and conferred on village boards under ch. 61, except those powers which conflict with statutes relating towns and town boards." See s. 60.22 (3). In addition, a town may become a city or a village by following the procedures in ss. 66.0201 to 66.0215 of the statutes.

Because towns may currently take actions that enable them to exercise village powers and because towns may follow certain procedures to become cities or villages, I'm not sure what Rep. Freese wants towns to be able to do that they can't do under current law. Please let me know exactly what you would like the bill to accomplish and what powers you would like towns to have that don't have now and I can enter a drafting request. Thanks for your help.

AN ACT .... relating to: authorizing a town board to exercise village powers.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, if a town meeting authorizes a town board to do so, the town board may exercise powers relating to villages and conferred on village hoards by statute, except those powers that conflict with statutes relating to towns and town boards. For example, a town board exercising village powers may not create a tax incremental financing district, annex territory, exercise extraterritorial zoning jurisdiction over another town or, in counties that have adopted a county zoning ordinance, enact a town zoning ordinance unless it is approved by the county board. If a town board exercises village powers, the town is still subject to annexation by a city or village and may be subject to extraterritorial zoning powers exercised by a city or village.

Under this bill, the power of a town meeting to authorize a town board to exercise village powers is repealed, and the bill authorizes a town board to enact an ordinance giving the board such powers.



## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, if a town meeting authorizes a town board to do so, the town board may exercise powers relating to villages and conferred on village boards by statute, except those powers that conflict with statutes relating to towns and town boards. For example, a town board exercising village powers may not create a tax incremental financing district, annex territory, exercise extraterritorial zoning jurisdiction over another town, or, in counties that have adopted a county zoning ordinance, enact a town zoning ordinance unless it is approved by the county board.
