Hi Tim. I have some changes to the draft of LRB-4200 that you prepared for me. Thank you for all of your drafting work.

First of all, I would like to change it so that it applies to the "Southeast Wisconsin freeway"....not just the Marquette and I-94. There is already a definition in the statutes that can be used.

Second, I would like to add a requirement that the department also contruct it that way...not just design. My worry is that the Department will design it and then construct it differently. If you think this is excessive paranoia, let me know. Maybe requiring the design of it precludes them from constructing it differently...just let me know.

Third, I think the draft might need a "notwithstanding" of the enumeration statutes. I think there may be two sections that may need to be nothwithstanded. I just don't want to have them design it one way and then not be able to construct it because of a lack of enumeration.

Finally, I thought I would add that the department should consult with the regional planning commission regarding projected vehicular traffic capacity needs. The department is already working with SEWRPC on this and I thought we should reference this.

Rep. Duff,

I finished the redraft of LRB-4200. You should have it Monday afternoon (or Tuesday morning at the latest). Please note the following:

- 1. The redraft applies to any SE Wisconsin freeway rehabilitation project, except resurfacing. See s. 84.014(1)(d) for the applicable definition of "rehabilitation". It seemed appropriate to exempt mere resurfacing from this requirement.
- 2. I don't think it is "excessive paranoia" to be concerned about DOT following through on the design requirement. If the statutory provision refers only to design, DOT could make specification changes that (essentially) undo the design requirement with respect to vehicular traffic capacity expansion. Thus "design and construct" is used.
- 3. In lieu of "notwithstanding" the enumeration statutes, I added the treatment in the Assembly super (LRBb1868/1) to the Joint Finance sub that excludes SE Wisconsin freeway rehabilitation projects from the definition of "major highway project". See Item #1298. I think this meets your intent. On the other hand, if you just wanted to make sure that this design requirement applied to any enumerated SE Wisconsin freeway rehabilitation project, I'd recommend adding a sentence to proposed s. 84.014(5) that reads: "This subsection applies to any project enumerated under s. 84.013(3) after the effective date of this subsection.... [revisor inserts date]."

I think these changes are consistent with your intent. Please let me know if I've headed off in the wrong direction in any way. Thanks.




