2 statutes; relating to: creating a ^{governor's} council on forestry.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill creates a 15-member council on forestry in the department of natural resources (DNR). Members of the council include: the chief state forester or his or her designee; four legislative members, one from each party and one from each house; and ten members who represent various forestry interests. These interests include ownership of private forest land, county forests, the paper and pulp industry, the lumber industry, the conservation of forest resources, and increasing the public's knowledge of forestry issues. These ten members are appointed by the governor, subject to senate confirmation. The council is authorized to advise the governor, legislature, DNR, and other state agencies on various topics as they affect forests located in this state. These topics include forest protection, reforestation and forestry genetics, urban forests, forestry research, and the marketing and use of forest products. The bill also requires that the council prepare a biennial report on the status of the state's forest resources and forest industry.

For further information see the **state and local** fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

14. One member who represents the interests of persons who engage in the practice of conservation education programs to increase the public's knowledge and awareness of forestry issues.

Thank you for all of your work in drafting LRBs0327/1 on such short notice.

At the committee meeting yesterday, committee members decided that they would like to make a few modifications to the substitute amendment. Basically, committee members would like the legislative member appointing authority to remain with the legislature, rather than the Governor's office. In doing so, committee members felt it was more appropriate to name the council the "Council on Forestry". To accomplish these goals, we would like to have a "slash two" of the substitute amendment drafted with the following changes:

- Strike page 1 - lines 7-10 of the substitute amendment and substitute the language found on page 2 - lines 5-8 of the original bill. This change would keep appointing authority in the legislature.
- Rename the council the "Council on Forestry" rather than the "Governor's Council on Forestry" as named in the substitute amendment. (This would involve about seven reference changes throughout the draft.)
- Strike page 3 - lines 5-9 of the substitute amendment and substitute the language found on page 3 - lines 3-4 of the original bill.

(b) Each member specified in par. (a) 2. to 5. shall be appointed in the same manner as members of standing committees are appointed. *(end of ins 3-10)*

(c) Each member specified in par. (a) 6. to 10. shall be nominated by the governor, and with the advice and consent of the senate appointed, to serve a 5-year term. *(end ins 3-10)*

(d) The governor shall annually appoint a chairperson for the council from among its members before the first meeting of each year, and the chairperson, at the first meeting of each year, shall annually appoint the vice chairperson and secretary from among the council's members. Any of these appointees may be appointed for successive terms.

(e) The council shall meet 4 times each year and shall also meet on the call of the chairperson of the council or on the call of a majority of its members. Notwithstanding s. 15.09 (3), the council shall meet at such locations within this state as may be designated by the chairperson of the council or by a majority of its members.

SECTION 2. 23.09 (3) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:

23.09 (3) (b) If the department and the board of regents of the University of Wisconsin System enter into an agreement to create a faculty position at the University of Wisconsin-Madison for a forest landscape ecologist, the department and the University of Wisconsin-Madison shall develop an annual work plan for the ecologist. In developing the annual work plan, the department shall consult with the governor's council on forestry created by executive order under s. 14.019.
