to: prohibiting cities, villages; towns, counties, and school districts from

imposing residency requirements on certain employees.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

ateacher

With some exceptions, this bill prohibits local governmental units (cities) villages towns, counties, and school district from requiring, as a condition of employment, that may nonelective employee or prospective employee reside within any jurisdictional limits. Exceptions to the general prohibition include certain public officials appointed by the mayor of a 1st class city (presently only Milwaukee) and certain school board officials. In addition, the prohibition does not apply to any other state law requiring residency for a municipal position or to any state or municipal requirement for state residency.

The bill also allows a local governmental unit to impose a residency requirement on police officers or firefighters that may not require such personnel to live closer than 15 miles outside of the boundary of the local governmental unit, although such personnel may choose to live closer to the boundary of the local governmental unit than the distance specified in the ordinance. If, however, a local governmental unit has in effect a less restrictive residency requirement on the effective date of the bill that applies to police officers or firefighters who are employed by the local governmental unit on the effective date of the bill, such personnel would

The examination, including minimum training and experience requirements, shall be job—related in compliance with appropriate validation standards and shall be subject to the approval of the board and may include tests of manual skill and physical strength.
