### Department of Health and Family Services 2001-2003 Remedial Legislation Statutory Language Request November 17, 2000

**Title: County Human Service Budgets** 

#### **Current Language:**

s. 46.40 (14m) COUNTY COMMUNITY AIDS BUDGETS. Before December 1 of each year, each county department under ss. 46.215, 46.22, 46.23, 51.42 and 51.437 and each tribal governing body shall submit to the department a proposed budget for the expenditure of funds allocated under this section, distributed under s. 46.45 (2)(a) or carried forward under s. 46.45(3)(a). The proposed budget shall be submitted on a form developed by the department and approved by the department of administration.

s. 46.031 County social services and mental hygiene budget and contract. (1) Budget. (a) Each county department under s. 46.215, 46.22, 46.23, 51.42 and 51.437 shall submit to the department by December 31 annually its final budget for services directly provided or purchased.

## The Administrative or Substantive problem with the Current Statutes:

s. 46.40 (14m) requires county departments of social services (46.215 & 46.22), human services (46.23), community mental health, developmental disabilities, alcoholism and drug abuse services (51.42), and developmental disabilities services (51.437) and tribes to submit a proposed budget for <u>community aids funds</u> before <u>December 1</u> of each year.

s. 46.031 requires county departments of social services (46.215 & 46.22), human services (46.23), community mental health, developmental disabilities, alcoholism and drug abuse services (51.42), and developmental disabilities services (51.437) [same agencies as above, minus tribes] to submit a final budget for services directly provided or purchased by December 31 of each year.

There are several problems with the current language.

- The language in 46.40 and 46.031 is inconsistent and overlapping. 46.40 & 46.031 applies to all county DSS, HSD, DCP & DD agencies. 46.40 applies to tribes; 46.031 does not. 46.40 requires the budget only for their community aids funds; 46.031 requires their budget for all services directly provided or purchased. The due dates are also different, i.e., December 1 & 31.
- When 46.40 (14m) was enacted, DHFS developed a form (DCS-875) that was approved by DOA for counties to use to report their annual human services proposed budget. They report

all expenditures on this form, not just community aids. This form is due to us by December 1 of each year. The current direction that we give counties combines the requirements of both sections of the statute. However, it would make more sense to clarify the language and have it only in one place. We should also remove tribes from this requirement since they do not budget or report on a calendar year basis.

- A more significant problem is that county aging units under 46.82 are not required to report their annual budgets. This leads to inconsistent and incomplete information in a variety of ways:
  - County aging units under 46.82 may be a part of a human services or social services department under 46.215, 46.22 or 46.23, and thus aging costs would be reported on the DCS-875 form that they submit. The instructions tell them to report projected allocations from the state related to their State/County Contract, anticipated county funds approved in the county budget, collections from private parties and third parties, projections of funds collected on behalf of agency clients by state mental health institutes, and direct state, federal and private grants. While they are not told to report funds that they receive from the Area Agencies on Aging, overhead costs to administer these programs are likely to be included in the HSD or DSS budget that they submit to us..
  - County aging units may be a separate aging department, as is the case in Milwaukee County. Since aging departments under 46.82 are not required to report their annual budget, we have no information on aging in these counties. In addition, separate aging departments may be designated under 46.27(3)(b) 6 to administer the COP program and may also provide other aging services funded under community aids (as is the case in Milwaukee). Because separate aging departments are not directly required to report, we do not have complete information on the county's long term care budget, and thus can't use the information collected to do statewide spending analysis or comparisons between counties.
  - ✓ In some counties, a private corporation serves as the aging unit. These corporations should be referenced and incorporated in the modifications to the annual budget reporting statutes.

### The Specific Statutory Change Requested:

Modify 46.031 to require all county aging units under 46.82 to report annually, change the due date to December 1 (as is currently in 46.40), and specify the form to be used as in 46.40. Repeal the language under 46.40(14m) which applies only to community aids and eliminate tribes from the requirement. 46.031 would read:

s. 46.031 County social services, mental hygiene and aging budget and contract. (1) Budget. (a) Each county department under s. 46.215, 46.22, 46.23, 46.82, 51.42 and 51.437 shall submit to the department by December 1 annually its final budget for services directly provided or purchased. The proposed budget shall be submitted on a form developed by the department and approved by the department of administration.


