Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill creates reporting and other requirements for subsidies that are provided to businesses by state and local government agencies. The bill requires agencies to develop written criteria for awarding subsidies that contain certain minimum requirements of businesses to remain eligible to receive subsidies. The bill requires businesses to enter into a written contract with the awarding agency, which must detail the goals and conditions of the award. The bill also creates certain reporting requirements of award recipients as well as granting agencies and requires the Legislative Audit Bureau to publish a report on business subsidies and to evaluate their effectiveness. The bill requires applicants to reveal any convictions for violations of state or federal violations of environmental or labor law. The bill also requires granting agencies to hold one public hearing in the political subdivision directly affected by the subsidy, and creates certain filing requirements of granting agencies.

The Department estimates that it will be unable to absorb the additional administrative and program expenses created by this bill. The Department anticipates the need for an additional 1.5 FTE Economic Development Specialists as a result of the hearing requirements. These positions will be necessary to prepare information regarding business subsidies in each Area Development regions, prepare documents for the annual reporting requirement and will represent the Department at hearings. In addition to salary and fringe benefit costs, these positions will need continuous access to vehicles, and will impose additional rent and one-time costs to the Department. The Department will also incur additional costs related to the posting of hearings as well as travel expenses. These costs are explained in detail below.

The Department's administrative costs will increase due to the filing requirements of the bill. The additional filing costs associated with this bill will necessitate a \$30,000 upgrade to the Department's current filing capabilities, as well as moving and rent expenses incurred from creating space for the anticipated documents. The Department anticipates the need to hire an additional 1.0 FTE Program Assistant to file and perform file maintenance on business subsidy and loan documents as well as helping staff prepare annual reports on business subsidies for LAB.

Local governmental expenses will vary depending on ability to grant subsidies, cost structures and staffing levels. Due to reporting requirements and the costs involved with ensuring compliance, local governments may be unable to absorb any additional costs created by this bill.
