Fitzgerald, M. Meyer, Darling and Harsdorf. Referred to Committee on Rules.

3	Whereas, a good turn rendered by a British Boy Scout in 1909 to Chicago
4	publisher, William D. Boyce, led to his incorporating the Boy Scouts of America on
