Joint Rule 28: This joint resolution prohibits the cochairpersons of every committee of conference from conferring together in private and permits less than one–half of the members of every committee of conference to confer together at the same time in private.

JOINT RULE 28. When conferences of members of committees of conference are open to the public. (1) Except as otherwise provided in sub. (2), a member of a committee of conference may confer together with one or more other members of the committee at the same time, for a conference that is not open to the public, if all of those conferring together at that time make up less than one-half of the members of the committee.

(2) A cochairperson of a committee of conference may not confer, for a conference that is not open to the public, with the cochairperson of the committee from the other house.
