## 1999 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 48

April 27, 1999 – Introduced by Representatives BALOW, SUDER, SCHNEIDER, SINICKI, GUNDRUM, HAHN, UNDERHEIM, HASENOHRL, GRONEMUS, MILLER, KREUSER, HUBER, MUSSER, F. LASEE, GROTHMAN, SYKORA, PLALE, ALBERS, POCAN, SERATTI, ZIEGELBAUER, SCHOOFF, KLUSMAN and COLON, cosponsored by Senators ERPENBACH, SCHULTZ, LAZICH, ZIEN, RUDE, BAUMGART and DECKER. Referred to Committee on Rules.

4           Whereas, in 1996 Congress passed, and the President signed, the Personal  
5     Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996 (PRWORA); and

6           Whereas, PRWORA contained numerous provisions geared toward  
7     strengthening state laws relating to child support enforcement and paternity  
8     establishment; and

9           Whereas, PRWORA, among other things, requires states to implement  
10    procedures under which the state has the authority to withhold, suspend or restrict  
11    the use of driver's licenses, professional and occupational licenses and recreational  
12    licenses, including hunting and fishing licenses, of individuals owing past-due  
13    support or failing, after receiving appropriate notice, to comply with subpoenas or  
14    warrants relating to paternity or child support proceedings; and

1           Whereas, the venue for enforcement under PRWORA is a person's individual  
2 social security number; and

3           Whereas, 1997 Wisconsin Acts 27 and 191 implemented these changes for the  
4 use of social security numbers as enforcement mechanisms, including for hunting  
5 and fishing license applications, to comply with the federal 1996 Personal  
6 Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act; and

7           Whereas, the requirement for social security numbers for hunting and fishing  
8 license applications by the federal and state governments, especially those of  
9 sportsmen and women, is a major, uncalled-for invasion of the right of privacy of  
10 individuals and is a solution that far exceeds the problem that it seeks to address;  
11 and

12           Whereas, the heavy-handed and overbroad efforts of Congress dictating to the  
13 states how to change family law is usurpation of an area of the law reserved to the  
14 states, and unreasonably ties together 2 distinctively different areas of the law by  
15 the threat of loss of federal funds; now, therefore, be it

16           ***Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That*** the Wisconsin  
17 legislature urges the members of the congressional delegation from this state to work  
18 to enact legislation that would remove social security numbers from hunting and  
19 fishing license applications; and, be it further

20           ***Resolved, That*** the assembly chief clerk shall send copies of this joint  
21 resolution to all of the members of the congressional delegation from this state.

11           Whereas, the heavy-handed and overbroad efforts of Congress dictating to the  
12 states how to change family law is usurpation of an area of the law reserved to the  
13 states, and unreasonably ties together 2 distinctively different areas of the law by  
14 the threat of loss of federal funds; now, therefore, be it

15           *Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That* the Wisconsin  
16 legislature urges the members of the congressional delegation from this state to work  
17 to enact legislation that would remove social security numbers from hunting and  
18 fishing license applications; and, be it further

19           *Resolved, That* the ~~senate~~ chief clerk shall send copies of this joint resolution  
20 to the President, the speaker of the U.S. house of representatives, the president of  
21 the U.S. senate, and all of the members of the congressional delegation from this  
22 state.
