**To amend** joint rule 51 (intro.); **relating to:** requiring the legislative reference bureau to include delayed effective dates in certain drafts.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Joint Rule 51 (intro.): This rule is amended to require the legislative reference bureau to include a delayed effective date of at least one year in drafts of proposals that are for incorporation into the biennial budget bill and amendments to the biennial budget bill if the legislation would decrease the revenue or increase the cost of local governmental units.

Joint Rule 51. **Use of LRB legal services.** (intro.) No measure proposal may be introduced or offered for introduction unless it has been put in proper form by the legislative reference bureau. Only the persons authorized by this rule may use the drafting services of the legislative reference bureau to have measures proposals prepared for introduction or offering. The legislative reference bureau shall include a delayed effective date of at least one year in a draft of an amendment that is for
