1 **Relating to:** supporting President Bush’s efforts to extend unemployment
2 insurance benefits and urging support of a universal extension of
3 unemployment insurance benefits to cover all 50 states and all workers.

4 Whereas, President Bush is proposing the extension of unemployment
5 insurance benefits as a component of an economic stimulus package; and

6 Whereas, President Bush has called out to us: “We hear the cries of those who
7 have been laid off,” and, speaking for himself, his administration, and many other
8 elected officials: “We worry about the shock waves throughout the economy.”; and

9 Whereas, as members of the Wisconsin legislature, we have also heard the cries
10 of our constituents from Kenosha to Superior; and

11 Whereas, President Bush would limit the extension of benefits to those states
12 “hit hardest” by the recent terrorist attacks; and

13 Whereas, President Bush wants to cover only workers who lost their jobs after
14 the attacks of September 11; and
