4	employees, and translates that passion into profit", shouts Forbes; and
5	Whereas, Wisconsinites and bikers have always known most if not all of that
6	information but also know that Harley–Davidson, Inc., reflects Wisconsin and
7	Wisconsinites almost as well as Bucky Badger; and
8	Whereas, Forbes claims that Malcolm Forbes, the late owner of that magazine,
9	was pivotal in introducing Harleys to the business elite in the early 1980s; and
10	Whereas, Wisconsinites and bikers have always known that Tommy G. "Big
11	Hog" Thompson and Mark D. "Big Cheese" Bugher were helpful in the success of
12	Harley–Davidson, Inc.; and
13	Whereas, Forbes reported that since Harley–Davidson's initial public offering
14	in 1986 the company has generated 37% average annual earnings growth and its

shares have risen 15,000%, while Intel's shares rose a mere 7,200% since 1986 and
 GE's a paltry 1,056%; and

Whereas, Wisconsinites and bikers have always known that Harley–Davidson,
Inc., has always been a good corporate citizen of Wisconsin and is "Something Special
from Wisconsin"; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the members of the
Wisconsin legislature recognize Harley–Davidson, Inc., for being selected by *Forbes Magazine* as "Company of the Year" and for making Wisconsinites proud of the "most
Wisconsin" of all companies; and, be it further

Resolved, That the assembly chief clerk shall transmit copies of this joint
 resolution to Harley–Davidson Chief Executive Jeffrey Bleustein.
