

2001 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 105

March 7, 2002 – Introduced by Representatives STASKUNAS, DUFF, SINICKI, BOCK, PETTIS, TURNER, ALBERS, BERCEAU, MUSSER, MCCORMICK, J. LEHMAN, SYKORA, RYBA, WASSERMAN, LASSA, TOWNSEND, MILLER and CARPENTER, cosponsored by Senators GROBSCHMIDT, BURKE, SCHULTZ, DARLING and HARSDORF. Referred to Committee on Veterans and Military Affairs.

1 **Relating to:** memorializing Congress to pass House Resolution 1717, to require
2 department of veterans affairs pharmacies to dispense medications to veterans
3 for prescriptions written by private practitioners.

4 Whereas, our nation owes a great debt to the veterans of our armed forces; and

5 Whereas, many veterans are experiencing difficulty purchasing their
6 prescription drugs; and

7 Whereas, veterans without severe service-connected disabilities and whose
8 income is above the level that makes them eligible for free care may obtain needed
9 medications at veterans affairs facilities for the very reasonable cost of \$2 per
10 prescription per 30-day supply; and

11 Whereas, this program is only available to a veteran who has received a
12 prescription from a veterans affairs physician after an outpatient visit; and

13 Whereas, a veteran who is interested in participating in this program is faced
14 with long waiting periods before having an appointment with a veterans affairs
15 physician for an outpatient visit; and
