Whereas, the economic impact of September 11th is being felt in every state in the country; and

Whereas, trying to determine whether someone was laid off as a direct result of the September 11th terrorist attack would be extremely difficult in many cases; and

Whereas, the rise in unemployment makes it more difficult for workers unemployed before September 11th to find a job and makes it just as difficult for workers unemployed before September 11th as those unemployed after September 11th to find a job; and

Whereas, according to the Wisconsin Legislative Council Staff, when extended benefits were last made available by the federal government in 1991, benefits were available to all states and were 100% federally financed; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the assembly, That the members of the Wisconsin assembly urge President Bush and the Congress to support a universal extension of unemployment insurance benefits, to cover all 50 states and every worker and to be 100% federally financed, so as to help the American people now and get our economy moving again; and, be it further

Resolved, That the assembly chief clerk shall provide a copy of this resolution to the president and secretary of the U.S. senate, to the speaker and clerk of the U.S. house of representatives and to each member of the congressional delegation from this state attesting the adoption of this resolution by the 2001 assembly of the state of Wisconsin.
