1 **Relating to:** celebrating February 6, 2002, as Ronald Reagan Day in the state of
2 Wisconsin.

3 Whereas, Ronald Wilson Reagan, born of humble background in the state of
4 Illinois, worked throughout his life serving freedom and others, having been
5 employed as an entertainer, union leader, corporate spokesman, governor of
6 California, and President of the United States; and

7 Whereas, Ronald Reagan served with honor and distinction as the 40th
8 President of the United States of America, having been elected to 2 terms of office,
9 the 2nd of which he was victorious in 49 of the 50 states in the general election,
10 earning the confidence of three-fifths of the electorate, a record unsurpassed in the
11 history of American presidential elections; and

13 to enact his bold agenda of restoring accountability and common sense to
14 government, which led to an unprecedented economic expansion and opportunity for
