

## ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION 3

July 5, 2002 – Introduced by Representatives HUBLER, BALOW and REYNOLDS.

1     **Relating to:** the life and public service of Stanley Lato.

2             Whereas, Stanley Lato was born in Thorp, Wisconsin, on November 2, 1924,  
3     and died in Stanley, Wisconsin, on April 10, 2002; and

4             Whereas, Stanley Lato served in the United States Navy during World War II;  
5     and

6             Whereas, he operated a dairy farm near Gilman for many years; and

7             Whereas, he demonstrated his civic-mindedness by being active in local  
8     government, serving as town supervisor, as town chair, and as a member of the  
9     county board; and

10            Whereas, he was elected to the Wisconsin assembly and served in the 1975 and  
11     1977 sessions; and

12            Whereas, he served on the Agriculture, Commerce and Consumer Affairs,  
13     Health and Social Services, and Tourism committees, and was chairperson of the  
14     Retail Food Production Committee; and

1           Whereas, while in the assembly, he successfully authored legislation creating  
2           an official identifying seal and associated quality standards for Wisconsin dairy  
3           products; now, therefore, be it

4           **Resolved by the assembly, That** the Wisconsin assembly salutes the fine  
5           service of its former colleague, Stanley Lato, and mourns his passing; and, be it  
6           further

7           **Resolved, That** the assembly chief clerk shall provide copies of this resolution  
8           to Stanley Lato's wife of over 50 years, Elaine; and to his children, Wayne Lato, Diane  
9           Taylor, Laura Logan, Jessica Lato, and Katherine Glicklich.
