Subject: Drafting Request – School Aids

Please draft the following:

1. Reduce the appropriation under s. 20.255 (2) (ac) by \$150,000,000 in FY 2002-2003.
2. Replace the formula for calculating the revenue limit increase under s. 121.91 (2m)(e)2 with a flat \$60 per pupil increase.
3. Include language requesting (but not requiring) school districts to accommodate any reduction to the revenue limit increase under s. 121.91(2m)(e)2, as it existed prior to this act, without impacting the school district's instructional program.
4. Require the state superintendent to provide technical assistance to school districts to accommodate reductions to the revenue limit increase without impacting instructional programs.
5. Notwithstanding the definition of partial school revenues under s. 121.15 (3m)(a)1, limit the amount of the long-term debt service levy (referred to be DPI as Fund 30 costs) included in partial school revenues to the actual levy or \$480 million, whichever is less.

Here are my responses to your questions related to LRB 4490-1dn. Also, following my answer to question #3, I have a request for an additional amendment to the draft.

1. When you know the amount that you want to appropriate under s. 20.255 (2) (ac) in FY 2002-03, let me know and I'll insert it in SECTION 1.

Answer: After the \$150 million reduction is made to s. 20.255 (2) (ac), the total appropriation will be \$4,070,645,900 in FY 2002-03.

2. I amended s. 121.15 (3m) (c) because I assumed that the amount appropriated in FY 2002-03 would be specified in the text of s. 20.255 (2) (ac). [see 1. above.] OK? In fact you may wish to delay the date in s. 121.15 (3m) (c) until 2004 because the amount appropriated in FY 2003-04 will be determined in the 2003-05 biennial budget act.

Answer: While this goes a bit beyond the scope of what the Governor wants to address in this bill, I think it is a reasonable amendment. Could we extend this language so that the JCF determination procedure applies only the 2nd year in all future biennia (i.e., the odd-numbered fiscal years--FY03, 05, 07, etc.)?

3. Instead of requesting school districts to accommodate the revenue limit reduction without negatively affecting their instructional programs, I directed DPI to encourage school districts to do so. OK?

Answer -- O.K.

I also have an additional amendment to LRB 4490-1. The "primary guaranteed valuation per member" under s. 121.07 (7) (a) should be reduced from the current \$2 million per student to \$1,500,000 per student. The intent is to ensure that "1st tier only" school districts also bear some of the aid reduction.

After thinking about this a little more and reviewing some data, I would like to amend section 3 of LRB 4490, as follows:

SECTION 3. 121.15 (3m) (a) 1. g. of the statutes is created to read:

121.15 (3m) (a) 1. g. The amount by which the referenda-approved school district property tax levy for long-term debt service exceeds \$490,000,000 ~~\$480,000,000~~.

This wording more accurately reflects how the Fiscal Bureau defines debt in its analysis. I just want to be sure that the number (\$490 million) and the definition are in sync.

I'm assuming that this section is prefaced with the word "less," as in "less the amount by which debt exceeds \$480 million." Reading the on-line statutes it is hard to tell, since 121.15 (3m) (a) 1, under current law, is not divided into subsections.

Be forewarned, the debt service issue is still under discussion. The number (not the definition) could change again.

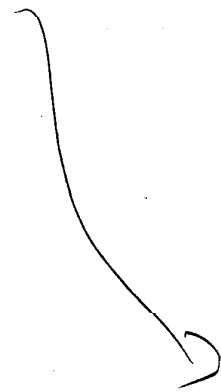
