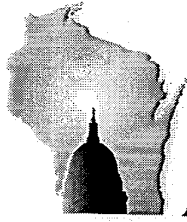

**Topic:** Medical and dental services co-pay

***Current Language***

Current language at s. 302.386 requires the Department of Corrections to collect from inmates a minimum of \$2.50 for each inmate-initiated request for medical or dental services. Administrative rules in the Department of Corrections set the fee at \$2.50 per request.

***Proposed Change***

Create nonstatutory language that would require the Department of Corrections to draft emergency administrative rules to increase the medical and dental services co-pay to ~~\$3.00~~ for each inmate-initiated visit and require the department to collect a prescription drug co-pay of \$3.00.

***Effect of the Change***

This change will require the Department of Corrections to increase the fees charged to inmates to medical and dental services.
