Hi Debora - I don't know if you are familiar with the federal funding the DHFS is receiving under PL 107-117 for bioterrorism response and preparedness.

Wisconsin is targeted to receive \$19.3 million for bioterrorism response including, (a) preparedness, planning and readiness assessment; (b) surveillance and epidemiology capacity; (c) laboratory capacity; (d) communicating health risks and health information dissemination; (e) education and training of public health officials, infectious disease workers, emergency department personnel and other health care providers; and (f) regional hospital planning.

20% is going to be made available to the state immediately.

The remaining money is subject to approval of a plan submitted by DHFS to federal DHHS. The plan is due no later than April 15, 2002. The money must be spent or unencumbered by August 30, 2003.

The Committee approved the following:

Require DHFS to submit the plan required under P.L. 107-117 to the Joint Finance Committee for review and approval prior to submittal to DHHS. (the members are aware that the bill will not likely be signed by April 15 - they will also write a letter to DHFS requesting them to submit the plan, but in order to strengthen their authority they wanted language included in the reform bill).

Direct DHFS to include, in its plan for the use of the federal funds available to states under P.L. 107-117, to the extent allowable under federal law, a proposal to allocate up to \$3,600,000 of the state's total allocation to fund: (a) communications equipment; (b) safety or protective equipment for law enforcement officers, fire fighters, emergency medical technicians, first responders or local emergency response team members who respond to emergencies; (c) training related to investigation or prevention of, or response to, acts of terrorism that pose a threat to the environment; (d) information systems, software, or computer equipment for investigating acts of terrorism that pose a threat to the environment; (e) training for specific special events where heightened security risks exist; (f) hazardous materials response teams or their expansion; and (g) volunteer emergency medical service entities that are short-staffed or in need of additional training.

I just realized there are a number of other things that DHFS is being required to include in their plan for use of the federal funding, to the extent permitted, including 2 of the alternatives I emailed you earlier about - the trauma system (paper # 2309 1168) and positions to increase the capacity of the state to perform surveillance of and respond to communicable and infectious diseases and biological and chemical threats to the state (paper #1169). — *2310*

The Committee also just voted to include funding for all costs incurred and anticipated by the State Lab of Hygiene related to bioterrorism threats (paper #1261 Alternative 3)
