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

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~~Governor~~ Require DHFS to issue a request-for-proposal (RFP) from entities that would submit proposal to engage in disease management activities on behalf of MA recipients. If DHFS contracts with an entity to engage in such activities, these entities would be required to provide close follow-up care to MA recipients.

This provision does not define disease management activities, nor is there a standard definition of disease management activities. However, a comprehensive disease management program usually involves identifying patients with the same diseases, using a multidisciplinary process to coordinate care for these individuals, developing treatment guidelines for a disease, provider education to improve patient care and increase efficiency in the delivery of care, and measuring appropriate outcomes to assess the results of such intervention.
