8 if any, and each insured retired employee shall contribute the balance of the required

3 fund the amount specified in paragraph (b) that would otherwise have been  
4 expended from each of the appropriations. The secretary shall make the lapse on the  
5 day on which the state agency would have been required to make the expenditure.  
6 After the secretary makes the lapse, each of the sum certain program revenues or  
7 program revenues–service appropriations is decreased by the amount specified in
