

Working Group Recommendation: Eliminate the Governor's Work-Based Learning Board and delete \$84,200 GPR and 1.0 GPR position in 2002-03 to eliminate the Executive Director's position. Transfer the Board's remaining staff, funding, responsibilities and functions to the Division of Workforce Solutions in the Department of Workforce Development (DWD) for administration.
