1. Cut additional perks for the speaker (pension multiplier- I believe only Jensen gets it) and other legislative leadership for no additional free office mailings other than the 13,000 we all get, and limit staff to three people).
2. 3 year freeze on state paid junkets.
3. No payment of legal fees for elected official relating to the caucus investigations - made retroactive.
4. 15% cut in per diem reimbursements, and office accounts for Legislature for next session.
- RAC 5. 15% cut in salary for Governor, Governor's agency/departments heads, constitutional officers (Lt. Gov., Tres., Sec State, etc.), and Legislature next session.
6. Per diem amount reduced by 50% for those Legislators earning outside income (non-full time legislators).
7. Prohibit the use of state funds for minting coins for the Governor's office and all other elected officials.
8. Require a legislative council study on reforming and overhauling the state budget process and requirement for Legislative approval or rejection by Sept 10th, 2002. or the measure will be automatically placed on the Nov. 5th election as a binding referendum.
9. Require a legislative council study on reforming and overhauling the Legislature (campaign finance and legislative process reform) and requirement for Legislative approval or rejection by Sept. 10th 2002 or the measure will be automatically placed on the Nov. 5th election as a binding referendum.
10. Reduce the size of the State Assembly to 66 members.
11. Require audit of DOT to ascertain costs and benefits to the state (compared to other states, WI has high gas tax, is state getting better roads and services for those higher taxes?)

 TO ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1,
 TO ASSEMBLY BILL 1

1 At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:

2 1. Page 366, line 11: after that line insert:

3 "1^{→20} ANNUAL SALARIES PAID TO CERTAIN STATE OFFICERS AND HEADS OF
 4 DEPARTMENTS AND INDEPENDENT AGENCIES.

5 (a) In this subsection, "head" has the meaning given in section 15.01 (8) of the
 6 statutes.

7 (b) Notwithstanding sections 20.923, 230.10, and 230.12 of the statutes and
 8 any action of the joint committee on employment relations relating to salary
 9 adjustments for any state officer or head, unless otherwise prohibited under the
 10 Wisconsin constitution, beginning on January 6, 2003, no state officer or head may
 11 receive a salary that is greater than 85% of the salary paid to the officer or head on
 12 the effective date of this paragraph for any period before July 1, 2005, unless the

1 state officer or head is appointed to a position different from the position that the
2 officer or head held on the effective date of this paragraph.

3 (c) Notwithstanding sections 20.923, 230.10, and 230.12 of the statutes and any
4 action of the joint committee on employment relations relating to salary adjustments
5 for any state officer or nonrepresented state employee, no person appointed to a state
6 officer position or to the position of head on or after the effective date of this
7 paragraph, but before July 1, 2005, may receive a salary that is at a rate greater than
8 the rate paid to his or her predecessor in that position.”
