(b) "U.S. flag" means anything that is or that purports to be the Stars and Stripes or a copy, picture, or representation of the Stars and Stripes.

created by the constitution or any law, including the legislature and the courts.

- (2) DISPLAY OF U.S. FLAG AT WORKPLACE; EMPLOYER MUST PERMIT. Subject to sub. (3), an employer shall permit an employee to display the U.S. flag at the workplace.
- (3) Nonapplicability. This section does not apply to a religious association or to an organization or corporation that is primarily owned or controlled by a religious association if displaying the U.S. flag conflicts with the religious doctrine of the religious association.
- **(4)** Retaliation prohibited. An employer may not discharge or otherwise discriminate against any person for displaying the U.S. flag at the workplace, filing a complaint or attempting to enforce the right to display the U.S. flag at the workplace, or testifying or assisting in any action or proceeding to enforce the right to display the U.S. flag at the workplace.
- (5) COMPLAINT. (a) Subject to par. (b), an employee who is discharged or otherwise discriminated against in violation of sub. (4) may file a complaint with the department, and the department shall process the complaint in the same manner that employment discrimination complaints are processed under s. 111.39.
- (b) Any employee of a state agency, as defined in s. 111.32 (6) (a), who is discharged or otherwise discriminated against in violation of sub. (4) may file a complaint with the personnel commission, and the personnel commission shall process the complaint in the same manner that employment discrimination complaints are processed under s. 111.39.

Section 274y. 106.54 (8) of the statutes is created to read:

106.54 **(8)** The division shall receive complaints under s. 103.165 (5) (a) and shall process the complaints in the same manner that employment discrimination complaints are processed under s. 111.39.".

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2. Page 181, line 15: after that line insert:

"Section 365p. 230.45 (1) (n) of the statutes is created to read:

230.45 **(1)** (n) Receive complaints under s. 103.165 (5) (b) and, except as provided in sub. (1m), process the complaints in the same manner that employment discrimination complaints are processed under s. 111.39.".

3. Page 438, line 8: after that line insert:

"(1x) DISPLAY OF U.S. FLAG AT WORKPLACE. The treatment of sections 103.165, 106.54 (8), and 230.45 (1) (n) of the statutes first applies to an employee who is affected by a collective bargaining agreement that contains provisions inconsistent with section 103.165 of the statutes, as created by this act, on the day on which the collective bargaining agreement expires, or is extended, modified, or renewed, whichever occurs first."
