✓ - Page 16, lines 3 - 4. I think we should add ", charter school sponsor, " after school district in both places. I think we just missed this in Act 16.

✓ - Page 19, lines 6 - 12. Again, I'm not sure we need to carry this over since it's now irrelevant.

✓ - Page 19, line 16. I think "board" should be "department" there.

✓ - Page 21, line 17. I think we need to change "June 30, 2002" to "December 31, 2005" because we extended that sunset in chapter 44 under Act 16. I think we needed to change it here as well to have the intended effect.

✓ - Page 24, lines 7 - 8. I think we need to delete the references to changes in appropriations for 2002-03, but keep the references to the change for 2001-02 (so, keep lines 16 -19 of the JFC bill). Then, I think the amount we need to transfer to DPI in line 4 of the draft will be \$498,800 - that will be the Act 16 number (639,700) minus the 5% cut (32,000) minus the 1% cut (6,400) minus the amount attributable to Doris (102,500).
