CN 5518 would increase comprehensive planning grant funding (as well as to move up the deadline for local governments to come into conformity with their plans). CN 7907 would restore the cut in comprehensive planning grant funding that was proposed by the governor and confirmed by JFC and the assembly. I am therefore drafting only CN 5518, which subsumes CN 7907.

CONFER VILLAGE POWERS ON TOWN BOARDS & OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES

Village Powers to Towns

MES

This amendment would modify the current law provision that authorizes a town board to exercise the powers of a village board by removing the condition that the authorization be approved at an annual or special town meeting. While town boards may exercise the powers of village boards, current law limits that authority to powers that do not conflict with other statutory provisions relating to towns and town boards.

No Fiscal Impact

Elimination of Gov/JFC Comprehensive Planning Grants Funding Reductions

This amendment would also eliminate the Governor's and Joint Finance Committee's proposed 11.7% reduction in funding for Comprehensive Planning Grants. Grants to local municipalities should be *increased* not decreased. In the absence of any funding increase for this program, the date by which any program or action of a local unit of government that affects land use must be consistent with the local government's comprehensive plan from January 1, 2010 to January 1, 2014.
