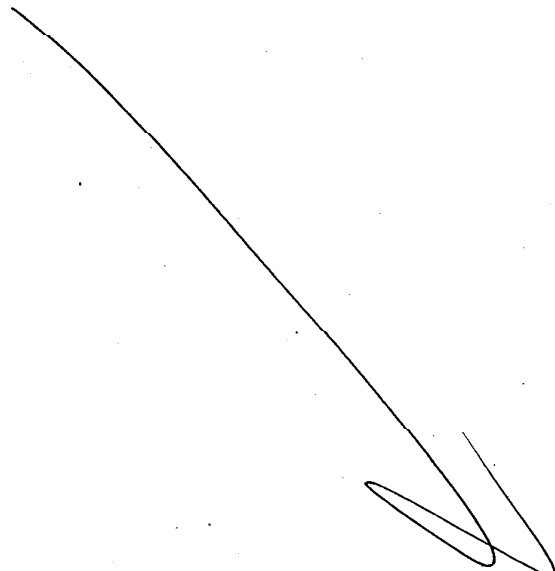

7 statutes in the department of justice that they enjoyed in the department of  
8 agriculture, trade and consumer protection immediately before the transfer.  
9 Notwithstanding section 230.28 (4) of the statutes, no employee so transferred who  
10 has attained permanent status in class is required to serve a probationary period.

11 (d) *Supplies and equipment.* All tangible personal property, including records,  
12 of the department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection that are primarily  
13 related to programs or functions that are transferred to the department of justice  
14 under this act are transferred to the department of justice. The departments of  
15 justice and agriculture, trade and consumer protection shall jointly identify the  
16 tangible personal property, including records, and shall jointly develop and  
17 implement a plan for their orderly transfer. In the event of any disagreement  
18 between the departments, the secretary of administration shall decide the question.  
19 If either department is dissatisfied with the secretary's decision, the department  
20 may bring the matter to the cochairpersons of the joint committee on finance for  
21 consideration by the committee, and the committee shall affirm or modify the  
22 decision.

23 (e) *Pending matters.* Any matter pending with the department of agriculture,  
24 trade and consumer protection that is primarily related to a program or function that  
25 is transferred to the department of justice under this act is transferred to the

1 department of justice. All materials submitted or actions taken by the department  
2 of agriculture, trade and consumer protection with respect to the pending matter are  
3 considered as having been submitted to or taken by the department of justice.

4 (f) *Contracts.* All contracts entered into by the department of agriculture, trade  
5 and consumer protection or the department of justice that are primarily related to  
6 programs or functions transferred to the department of justice under this act, and  
7 that are in effect on the effective date of this paragraph, remain in effect and those  
8 contracts entered into by the department of agriculture, trade and consumer  
9 protection are transferred to the department of justice. The departments of justice  
10 and agriculture, trade and consumer protection shall jointly identify these contracts  
11 and shall jointly develop and implement a plan for their orderly transfer. In the event  
12 of any disagreement between the departments, the secretary of administration shall  
13 decide the question. If either department is dissatisfied with the secretary's decision,  
14 the department may bring the matter to the cochairpersons of the joint committee  
15 on finance for consideration by the committee, and the committee shall affirm or  
16 modify the decision. The department of justice shall carry out the obligations under  
17 these contracts until the obligations are modified or rescinded by the department of  
18 justice to the extent allowed under the contract.

19 (g) *Rules and orders.* All rules promulgated by the department of agriculture,  
20 trade and consumer protection that are in effect on the effective date of this  
21 paragraph and that are primarily related to programs or functions that are  
22 transferred to the department of justice under this act remain in effect until their  
23 specified expiration date or until amended or repealed by the department of justice.  
24 All orders issued by the department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection  
25 that are in effect on the effective date of this paragraph and that are primarily related

1 to programs or functions transferred to the department of justice under this act  
2 remain in effect until their specified expiration date or until modified or rescinded  
3 by the department of justice.

4 (h) *Decrease in positions.* The authorized FTE positions for the department of  
5 agriculture, trade and consumer protection, funded from the appropriation under  
6 section 20.115 (8) (jm), 1999 stats., are decreased by 5.5 PR positions.”.

8 “(2xz) INCREASE IN POSITIONS. The authorized FTE positions for the department  
9 of justice, funded from the appropriation under section 20.455 (1) (j) of the statutes,

19 department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection by 41.25 GPR positions  
20 related to those consumer protection programs, functions, and enforcement  
21 activities.

24 20.115 (8) (a) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 2001, the dollar amount is

1 decreased by \$292,400 for fiscal year 2002–03 to reflect the transfer of certain  
2 consumer protection programs, functions, and enforcement activities to the  
3 department of justice and to decrease the authorized FTE positions for the  
4 department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection by 2.5 GPR positions  
5 related to those consumer protection programs, functions, and enforcement  
6 activities.”.

8 “(10xo) CONSUMER PROTECTION TRANSFER. In the schedule under section 20.005  
9 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of justice under section  
10 20.455 (1) (a) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 2001, the dollar amount is  
11 increased by \$1,502,200 for fiscal year 2002–03 to reflect the transfer of certain  
12 consumer protection programs, functions, and enforcement activities from the  
13 department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection and to increase the  
14 authorized FTE positions for the department of justice by 26.0 GPR positions related  
15 to those consumer protection programs, functions, and enforcement activities.”.


